Ann's Angel Fund: \$8,887

Six-year-old Merveille, whose name means "wonder" in French, is the son of pastors in the Togo FMC. He loves singing and instruments, especially the piano. Merveille developed cataracts around two years old and began to lose his sight. Too young for corrective surgery, Merveille would pray for God to restore his sight. Through the help of Ann's Angel Fund, Merveille got his surgery. Now he can see!

2 Wunders: 1,200 kits

In partnership with the Set Free Movement, ICCM provided over 1,200 Wunders kits to girls in Burundi, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, and Togo. Many girls in Sub-Saharan Africa miss school each month during their menstrual cycles due to a dearth of affordable menstrual products. Wunders kits contain hygiene materials, including reusable pads and new underwear. The girls' teachers testify to the power of Wunders products, citing their students' greater confidence and higher self-esteem.

Animals and Agriculture: \$47,322

In the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Linda Striker Academy (LSA) embarked on a mission to educate its students about environmental conservation and to nurture a love for nature that would last a lifetime. Through the LSA School Greening Project, the children planted 105 trees, creating a lush green environment within the school grounds and protecting LSA from the unpredictable weather of nearby Lake Tanganyika.
